Ethical Considerations for Recruitment

This study will be guided by a client centred approach which places the participant at the centre of the research.

This approach affords the participant the opportunity to negotiate ongoing consent and to identify how best they can be supported before, during and after the interview process.

The researchers are willing to work through key support workers with agencies to identify families that might be willing to participate in the research following the protocol identified above

The researchers are seeking to conduct the interviews in a supportive environment which will facilitate the needs of the participants
