Participants will also be invited to participate in round table discussions which will take place following the completion of the three stages listed above. However, participation in these discussions is an optional extra, and not a prerequisite for taking part in the study.

Participation in this study is on a voluntary basis and participants may withdraw from the study at any time. All information collected in interviews and classroom observations will be treated in confidentiality and will not be made available to third parties. The collected data will be retained for the duration of the study and for a further six months, after which time it will be destroyed. The results of the research presented in the final thesis will be seen by my supervisor, second reader and the external examiner. The results of the study may be published in an academic journal. Any quotes from or opinions expressed by participants will be presented anonymously, in order that the identities of both the participants and their pupils are not revealed in the final thesis.
