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A number of issues regarding supervision and duty of care have recently arisen in schools. Determining acceptable levels of supervision and defining the school's duty of care is one issue that exercises the minds of many Boards of Management and principals. While there is no prescriptive answer provided by the DES, the liability of the BoM is predominantly based on judicial decisions and precedence in previous cases.

IPPN have compiled a number resource bundles on frequently-asked questions that IPPN's Leadership Support Service receive and provides best practice and advice. However, it is advisable that a school contact their school insurance provider to receive specific guidance regarding their individual circumstances.
